

THE SCHOLARSHIP

The Dafydd Lewis Trust provides equity and merit-based scholarships of \$10,000 a year, for three years, to young men who might not have otherwise received a university education due to the limited financial resources.

Multiple scholarships are awarded every year for full-time undergraduate degrees in most courses at any university in Victoria.

Established under the Dafydd Lewis Will in 1942, this scholarship is for young men completing Year 12. Girls can apply via the [Mary Jane Lewis Scholarship Foundation](#).

LEGAL ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be studying a full-time undergraduate degree, at a tertiary institution in Victoria, in any course other than music, theology, education, or the arts.

Applicants applying to undertake an arts course must be enrolled with the purpose of gaining entry to a course which was previously offered by that institution as an undergraduate degree but is now only offered at the postgraduate level

AUSTRALIAN CITIZENS

Applicants must have attended a Victorian State Secondary School for at least five (5) consecutive years immediately preceding the award of the scholarship.

Applicants must be no more than 19 years old on the 1st of January 2024.

AUSTRALIAN VISA HOLDERS

Applicants who have entered or have remained in Australia under a Visa issued by the Commonwealth of Australia for any of the following grounds are eligible to apply:

- they, their parent or parents or any other person should be granted asylum in Australia; or
- they, their parent or parents or any other person were refugees; or
- any other humanitarian grounds.

Those eligible to apply holding a visa on the grounds of the above must:

- have attended a Victorian state school for at least two (2) consecutive years immediately preceding the award of the scholarship; and
- be no more than 21 years old on the 1st of January 2024.

PARENTAL INCOME ELIGIBILITY

Applicants combined parental/guardian income must not exceed \$95,310.80 per annum (as per their most recent tax return/income statement).

THE APPLICATION PROCESS & TIMELINE

Applications open: Monday 4th of September 2023
Applications close: Saturday 23rd of December 2023 (11:59pm)

The Dafydd Lewis Trust assesses applicants via two stages:

1. Written application
2. Interview

Applicants will be notified if they are successful in the written application stage, in January of 2024.

Applicants successful in making it to the Interview stage will be invited to interview in early February of 2024. Interviews are held at Equity Trustees offices and applicants are strongly encouraged to attend in person. Details regarding the exact time and date of interviews will be provided to successful applicants closer to the date.

This is a formal interview and should be treated as such. We recommend applicants treat this as they would a job application.

Applicants that make it to the interview stage will be notified to the outcome of their application no later than March 2024.

COMPLETING YOUR APPLICATION

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

All documentation should be uploaded under the following naming convention:

The following legal documents are required to be submitted with your application:

- Birth Certificate
- Australian Commonwealth Visa (if applicable)
- VTAC ATAR Certificate
- Parent/Guardian's most recent Tax Return or Centrelink payment summary
- Proof of Government Allowance (if applicable)
- A personal statement
- A personal referee statement

APPLICANT DETAILS

Applicants are required to upload accurate and up to date contact details. Contact details should be that of the applicant not of a parent/guardian or careers advisor.

Applicants are to upload a clear and legible copy of their birth certificate and or Commonwealth visa.

Applicants are to list all schools attended for the duration of their secondary education.

ATAR RESULTS

Applicants cannot submit their application until ATAR results have been released on the 11th of December 2023.

Applicants are to supply details of their High School Certification (i.e VCE or IB) as well as their ATAR and ATAR certificate. Please note we do not require a copy of your study score certificate, only your ATAR certificate or VTAC Results.

- Please note we do not accept screenshots of results, only certification as supplied by VTAC.

Applicants are to supply the details of the University Degree and Institution that they have nominated as their first preference with VTAC, or that they have accepted an early offer to.

APPLICANT FAMILY DETAILS & FINANCIAL ASSESSMENT

Applicants are only required to provide the contact & financial details of parent/guardians that directly care or provide for them. E.g. if you are estranged from a parents you are not required to list their details or financials.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Parents living apart, or who are legally separated and are contributing toward child support of spousal support payments, must be included in the weekly income amount of the primary parent.

Applicants are required to upload a copy of their parent/guardian's most recent tax return (if employed) or their Centrelink payment summary (if unemployed or under-employed)

OTHER INCOME

Applicants are required to list "other Income" of their parent/guardian separate from their employment (excluding government allowance).

Details are to be provided in an approximate value; no supporting documentation is required to be submitted.

The scholarship panel are interested in understanding how you will actively engage in some or all of these events throughout the year.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

The personal statement is to be one to two (1-2) pages which helps us get to know you, and how the Dafydd Lewis Scholarship could help you achieve your goals.

Please ensure your name is clearly written at the top of the letter.

The statement should be written as if you were speaking directly to the scholarship panel or as a cover letter to your application.

Themes that you may wish to discuss:

- Why you want to study at university and why you are interested in your area of study
- What motivates you
- Accomplishments you are proud of (academic or otherwise)
- Your personal values
- Your experiences and interests outside of school

REFEREE STATEMENT

A personal referee statement, no longer than one (1) page, is to be provided by a trusted source that has known you for an extended period. This can be anyone, except a family member, but may for example be a trusted teacher, school principal, an employer or sport coach.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST
